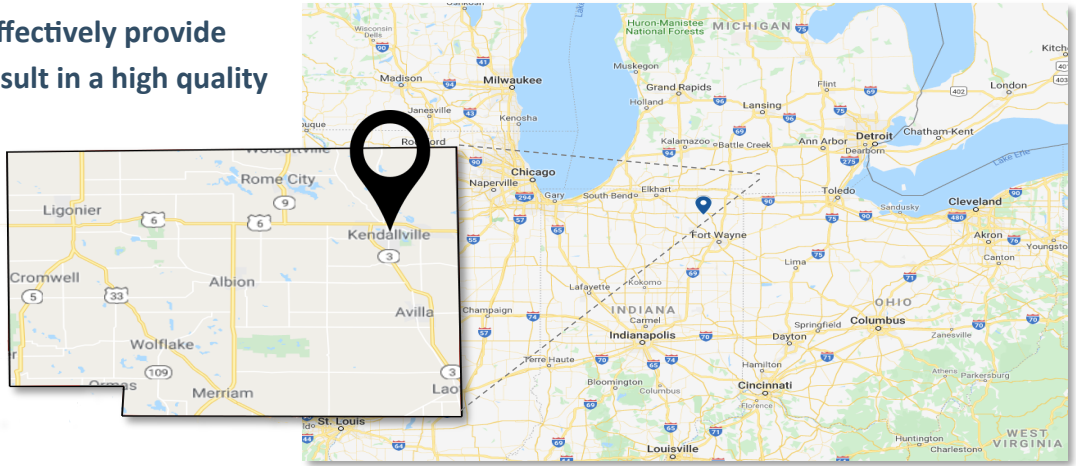


KENDALLVILLE

NOBLE COUNTY, INDIANA

Kendallville, a growing city of 10,271 residents, is Noble County’s largest population center. Located on the east side of the county along US 6, Kendallville is 11 miles west of I-69, 30 miles south of the Indiana Toll Road, and a 40 minute drive north of Fort Wayne on State Road 3.

Kendallville’s 450-acre East Industrial Park is an impressive, well-maintained area served by Norfolk Southern Railway. Manufacturers located in the park including Dow Corning, Hendrickson, LSC Communications, Creative Liquid Coatings and Graphic Packaging. Manufacturing roots run deep here with more than 38% of Noble County’s workforce employed in target industries that include advanced manufacturing, ag and food production, automotive supply and medical device technology. Other notable Kendallville employers include Flint & Walling, Kraft Heinz, KPC Media Group and Parkview Noble Hospital.

The Kendallville Municipal Airport just north of the city offers a 10,000 square foot heated hangar and is home to more than 40 small planes. A 4,000 foot runway serves flyers year-round.

Kendallville’s leadership has shown a strong commitment to investing in infrastructure and quality of life. Since 2020, the city has seen nearly \$8 million in public and private investments for improvements in the registered Downtown Kendallville Historic District including a new Main Street streetscape, pocket park, solar field installation to power wastewater treatment, and real property improvements to restore and preserve historic integrity.

All of the communities of Noble County are actively developing a mix of new housing units, including Kendallville.


Construction is set to begin in 2022 on 75 new homes in a newly annexed development there.

Projects totaling over \$3.4 million in 2019 included the completion of the Kendallville Outdoor Sports and Recreation Complex, an 89-acre facility. The Fishing Line Trail, a bike trail connecting Rome City to Kendallville, is one of the many outdoor recreation amenities across the county that makes the region a destination for outdoor enthusiasts. The city is also recognized as an Audubon Bird Town.
